
LOCATED ON THE GROUNDS OF THE FIRST CHEROKEE NATIONAL FEMALE SEMINARY,

ATTRACTIONS

DILIGWA

Time travel to Diligwa – a 1710 outdoor
Cherokee living village – located on the grounds of the
Cherokee Heritage Center. Here, observe Cherokee
life during the early eighteenth century. Villagers
demonstrate traditional Cherokee crafts
while explaining history and culture.

SPECIAL EXHIBIT GALLERY

This gallery houses a variety of Cherokee themed exhibits throughout the year in addition to featuring two, nationally recognized Native American art shows.

CHEROKEE FAMILY RESEARCH CENTER

The Cherokee Family Research Center (CFRC) was established to aid persons in search of their Cherokee heritage and ancestry. CFRC resources from the Trail of Tears (1838 - 1839) to the Dawes enrollment (1900 - 1906) are specific to Cherokee people.

ADAMS CORNER RURAL VILLAGE

Explore the great change in Cherokee society in the days before Oklahoma statehood. At your own pace, tour a general store, three different types of housing, a school and a church in this 1890s setting.





TRAIL OF TEARS EXHIBIT

The Trail of Tears exhibit chronicles the forced removal of Cherokee ancestors from their indigenous homeland to Indian Territory, present-day Oklahoma. The exhibit is staged in six galleries and includes documentation and artifacts.
