

Pest control scope

Areas to include: Ross School Museum, Cherokee Nation Prison Museum, Supreme Court Museum, Sequoyah's Cabin, Restaurant of The Cherokees, Cherokee Nation Gift Shop, Outpost Retail Store #1, office spaces on 4th street and Woodmark Building.

Treated areas will include: kitchens, storage rooms, external storage buildings, office space, bathrooms, break rooms, dining areas, mechanical rooms, closets, beverage areas, drainage traps, back of the house areas and the exterior perimeters of buildings.

Treatment of all locations for typical pest such as but not limited to the following: ants, roaches, beetles, rodents, snakes, termites, sewer trap flies, wasps, bees and any other pests.

Preventative pest control for termites on required sites as needed.

Treatment in food and kitchen areas on a schedule or as needed, with limited fogging in food areas.

Summaries or documentation of any pest control performed on these sites turned in to the manager of these areas for record keeping and logging of treatments for invoicing.

Awarded vendor must be able to be on call for response 7 days a week for a 24 hour period throughout the term of service contract.

Cherokee Nation Pesticide Application Notification System Act

1) General notification of pesticide use will be provided to Cherokee Nation Environmental Programs no less than 48 hours prior to application.

EXEMPTIONS TO THE 48 HOUR NOTIFICATION:

- a. Emergency applications required by public health officials.
- b. Disinfectants, sanitizers, deodorizers, or microbial agents used for general cleaning purposes.
- c. Baits and traps used for pest control.
- d. If there is a weekly schedule, notify the CN Environmental Programs department of the reoccurring schedule.

2) After completion of the pesticide application, the form titled, "Pesticide Application Information Final Report", (attached), will be sent to Cherokee Nation Environmental Programs.

- a. If the pest contractor documentation lists all of the information required on the document, they may fill out the top line of the form only and attach a copy of their paperwork.

3) Any pest contractor must be licensed by a state governing authority for the category of pesticide application in which the person is engaged.

4) Any herbicides that are used must be reported under this Act.

5) It is the responsibility of the contractor to meet the provisions of this act. This includes completing the Pesticide Application Notice and the Pesticide Application Information Final Report.

6) Penalties will be enforced should a contractor not comply with this Act, including specified dollar amounts and notification to the state licensing authority for further investigation.
