- 3. Will the training location(s) be provided by the Nation, or is the contractor expected to secure a venue within the jurisdiction?

- 4. What is the expected duration of each session (e.g., hours per day, number of days)? No expected hours or numbers of days, just needs to be community policing-based training.
- 5. Will the training be delivered to one group or across multiple cohorts? The training will be for our Deputy Marshals.
- 6. Is there a preferred time frame for training delivery (weekdays vs. weekends, or time and day)? Weekdays 0800-1700

- 7. Are there any required deliverables beyond in-person instruction (e.g., printed materials, certificates, evaluations)? If the class requires printed materials, we would like to have them available for attendees. If there is some sort of certificate of completion that you offer with each course, we would like each attendee to receive one.
- 8. Will the Nation provide onsite resources (e.g., AV equipment, tables, projector), or should these be included in the proposal?
