



TREE STRAP LOOP AT FIRST BRANCH, USE RUBBER HOSE OR APPROVED EQUAL TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO TREE 12 GAUGE GALVANIZED WIRE & 1-1/2 PVC PIPE 4" ORGANIC MULCH PER SPECIFICATIONS. DO NOT PLACE MULCH AGAINST TREE TRUNCK REMOVE WIRE BASKET AND REMOVE BURLAP \$ ROPE FROM TOP & OF ROOT BALL TREE SAUCER (FORMED BY MIN. 4" THICK MULCH) 8' METAL TEE STAKE. PLANTING NOTES

A. HOLE DIAMETER SHOULD BE AT LEAST TWICE THE DIAMETER OF THE SHRUB ROOT BALL. SHRUB CROWN SHOULD BE PLACED SLIGHTLY HIGHER (1-2") ABOVE THAN SURROUNDING FINISHED 3. SCORE ROOTBALL BY CUTTING $\frac{1}{6} - \frac{1}{4}$ " VERTICAL GROVES 3" B. SPACE PLANTS PER PLANTING PLAN

CONTAINER SHRUB PLANTING DETAIL

Landscape Plan General Notes:

1. The Contractor Shall Furnish All Labor, Materials, Tools, Equipment, And Related Items Required For The Complete Installation Of Landscape. 2. All Plant Material Shall Be Nursery Grown. Plant Material Sizes And Grading Shall Comply With The Latest Edition Of American Standards For Nursery Stock, Published By The American Nursery And Landscape Association.

3. All Plant Material Shall Be Healthy And Free From All Visible Signs Of Disease Or Pest Infestation.

4. Contractor Shall Ascertain Location Of All Utilities Prior To Excavation. Prior To Commencing With Any Work, Contact The State One-call.

5. No Changes To Approved Plant Schedule Will Be Allowed Without The Approval Of The Owner's Representative.

6. All Trees Shall Be Installed, Mulched, Guyed, And Staked Per The Details. All Shrubs Shall Be Installed And Mulched Per The Details. 7. Hardwood Mulch, A Minimum Of 2" Depth, Shall Be Applied To All Planting Beds Shown On This Plan.

8. The Contractor Shall Provide A One Year Minimum Warranty For All Plant Materials And Installation From The Date Of Acceptance. 9. The Contractor Shall Spoil Any Excess Topsoil Located On The Site That Is Not Required To Perform Landscape Operations. If Sufficient Topsoil Is Not Present On Site, The Contractor Shall Import Topsoil To The Site In Order To Complete The Landscape Operations. The Contractor Shall

Perform A Soil Test On The Existing And Imported Topsoil And Apply Lime And Fertilizer As Recommended By The Testing Agency. 10. In All Planting Beds, Sod Shall Be Removed Entirely And Soil Shall Be Amended With Twelve Inches Of Topsoil And A Minimum Of Six Inches

Site Seeding and Sodding Note:

All Disturbed Areas To Be Seeded Shall Be Topsoiled To A Minimum Depth Of 4", Fertilized At A Rate Of 250 Pounds Per Acre, And Seeded With Annual Rye Grass At A Rate Of 3-4 Pounds Per 1000 S.F. And Turf-Type Fescue Grass At A Rate Of 8 Pounds Per 1000 S.F. The Area Must Also Be Mulched. If The Seeded Areas Are 20% Or Greater Slope, Erosion Control Mat Shall Be Installed. The Contractor Shall Water And Maintain The Grass Until A Healthy Permanent Stand Is Established.


All Disturbed Areas To Be Sodded Shall Be Topsoiled To A Minimum Depth Of 4", Fertilized At A Rate Of 250 Pounds Per Acre, And Sodded With Bermuda Grass. If Located On Slopes 3:1 Or Greater, The Corners Of The Sod Must Be Pinned. The Contractor Shall Water And Maintain The Grass Until A Healthy Permanent Stand Is Established.


All Areas Over 15% Shall Be Planted As Above, But Shall Also Be Covered With Erosion Control Fabric.

Areas To Be Sodded Are Designated By The Dotted Hatch As Shown in The Legend On The Plan.

Wildflower Seeding Note:

All Areas Designated for Wildflower Seeding Shall Be Topsoiled To A Minimum Depth Of 4", Fertilized At A Rate Of 250 Pounds Per Acre, And Seeded With Holland Wildflower 'Native Light Shade Mix' At A Rate Of 1 Pounds Per 1000 S.F. The Area Must Also Be Mulched with Cherokee Manufacturing Excelsior Netting. The Contractor Shall Water And Maintain The Wildflower Seed Until A Healthy Permanent Stand Is Established.


