### Pertinent Points of Bid Packet:

<u>Pertinent dates</u> – The deadline for bids is November 5, 2020 at 10:00 am. Bids must be received on or before the deadline to be considered. Bids must be clearly marked "Sealed Bid, Do Not Open, Turnkey Construction RFSB # 2020-001-058" A public bid opening will NOT be held.

<u>Interpretations — Every request for interpretation of the meaning of the plans, specifications, or other pre-bid documents must be submitted in written format to the Housing Authority of the Cherokee Nation. Requests may be e-mailed to <u>Carla.henson@hacn.org</u> or faxed to (918) 431-9306, Attention: Carla Henson. No interpretation of the meaning of the plans, specifications, or other pre-bid documents will be made to any bidder orally. Interpretation request must be received by October 30, 2020 by 5:00 pm. Interpretations for this bid shall be posted by November 2, 2020 at 5:00 pm.</u>

NOTE the difference between single and non-single close on the Bid Form. Units identified as Single Close on the bid form you cannot start until the loans have been closed between the HACN and the Bank and the mortgages have been filed in the appropriate county. <u>Willard Mounce - (TERO)</u> – Tribal Law, Indian Preference, and TERO fee. If awarded the job, please come and visit with TERO before starting the job. We require a weekly project form – for every non- \$25/day will be paid. Cherokee 1<sup>st</sup>, Indian 2<sup>nd</sup>. Handout as written.

<u>Scope of work</u> – Per Construction Manager and Assistant Construction Manager - As written.

\*\* we have tried to mark out any information on the individual site information sheets that could read as questionable. Bid the units turnkey, meaning its contractors responsibility. Fill in well drilling cost sheet, we may negotiate with you or remove entirely, we want to know what you are bidding per foot as this cost increases the Total Construction cost. Contractor should include Chemical Analysis and Microbiological Testing/Bac T testing in your well bid. Chemical Analysis testing will include a water quality test including Alkalinity, PH, Hardness, Total dissolved solids, chloride, Sulfate, Nitrate/Nitrite, Fluoride, Iron, Manganese, Lead, Arsenic. HACN will send to Water & Sanitation for a clearance for Human consumption and a breakdown of Primary and Secondary contanoments. At that time, the cost may be negotiated with the contractor for any filter systems needed on any/all primary contanoments. You will also provide a Microbiological testing /Bac T test when connected to the home. This testing will include Total Coliform, Fecal Coliform and E Coli presence/Absence. If this test fails, the first time the contractor will be responsible disinfecting and re-testing at his own expense. In the past the contractor has not properly disinfected the fittings prior to containing and submitting the samples, this has resulted in the responsibility shifting to the HACN. Inspector MUST BE ON SITE when drilling the well. If not notified and on site, the Contractor will assume all cost associated with the drilling and testing of the well.

NOTE: WE WOULD RATHER HOOK TO RURAL WATER IF AVAILABLE THAN DRILL WELLS.

### All tree's must be removed by March 31, 2021 on all sites.

Contact HACN Inspector to assist with the house/drive layout. Make sure all pins are located. Contractor will need to bring off site material, we will not allow material to be used for the site, this has caused drainage problems in the past. We will not build on FLAT sites; pads will be built up to allow for run off.

Contractor is responsible for calling the inspector if it is raining and they are unable to work. If we do not have it documented, we will hold you to the 180 days. Let us know if you are unable to work., we suggest that you call every day to keep us posted. Rain Days are only approved if it is feasible, if you are working inside then you should expect to work, and rain day request will be denied.

Access and Utility Easements – turn in the (proposed and established) easements in the bid packets with the utility applications, this is the way that HACN has chosen to bring utilities, if the utility company can't use the existing easements then we will need it documented. Any additional easements will need to be approved and copies of the filed easements will need sent back to HACN.
